#### GOSPEL

After hearing his doctrine many of the followers of Jesus said, 'This is intolerable language. How could anyone accept it?' Jesus was aware that his followers were complaining about it and said, 'Does this upset you? What if you should see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before? 'It is the spirit that gives life, the flesh has nothing to offer. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life. 'But there are some of you who do not believe.' For Jesus knew from the outset those who did not believe, and who it was that would betray him. He went on, 'This is why I told you that no one could come to me unless the Father allows him.' After this, many of his disciples left him and stopped going with him. Then Jesus said to the Twelve, 'What about you, do you want to go away too?' Simon Peter answered, 'Lord, who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that you are the Holy One of God.'

DID YOU KNOWS

Points of interest and Catholic lore

- This is another example of how Peter, in the gospels, often takes a leadership role among the twelve.
- Peter's role of leadership among the chosen is why, to this day, his successor, the Pope, has a special position among the leaders of the Church.
- In John's Gospel, the author often uses the device of 'dualism' to contrast life in the Spirit with the life of this earthly existence.

Dear Fr Jerald,

Thank you for your email of 10 June 2021 addressed to the Archbishop in relation to the *Way of the Gospel* and how this intersects with the process for the Plenary Council of the Catholic Church in Australia.

Your letter has been forwarded to me as Vicar General. I apologise for the delay in responding to you as I have been away from Melbourne.

I have read your letter with interest and appreciate the respectful and articulate way in wish you have communicated your points. As Vicar General, it is important that both Archbishop Peter and I hear first-hand the thoughts and opinions of the priests of the Archdiocese as well as parishioners and lay leaders.

I was delighted to learn that as Parish Priest you are working in close collaboration with your Parish Council and that they are taking an active interest and involvement in both the Plenary Council and *The Way of the Gospel* process. This bodes well for the future of our Archdiocese going forward.

The Plenary Council of the Catholic Church in Australia called by the Bishops of Australia invites the Catholic community to reflect on where the Spirit might be leading us at this particular time. The *Instrumentum laboris*, draws heavily on the voices heard during the Listening and Dialogue and Listening and Discernment phases of the Plenary Council, but also from other key sources. It is entitled *Continuing the Journey*. This is an exciting step forward and we take it together, amidst a time of great change. More than 220,000 people participated in the first stages of Listening and Dialogue, and those voices can be heard clearly in the working document.

While they have a different focus, both the Plenary Council and the *Way of the Gospel* process here in the Archdiocese of Melbourne are also in a sense somewhat complementary, both involving a deeper sense of discernment amongst clergy and laity. The Plenary Council will of course focus more on what we might describe as exploring some of the "big picture" issues facing the Catholic Church in Australia today, encompassing a very broad range of issues.

The Way of the Gospel on the other hand, focusses more specifically on the realities of our local Church here in the Archdiocese of Melbourne at both a pastoral, spiritual and practical level. Its

more about how we might work together co-operatively with the priests and people of the Archdiocese in not only reinvigorating our parish communities but reflecting on how this reality may be lived "on the ground" in our local parish communities in years to come.

It should be noted that similar work has also commenced in a number of other dioceses around Australia including the recent launch of a parish renewal program in the Archdiocese of Sydney.

The Way of the Gospel - the path of missionary discipleship—has always been adapted by every generation to fit the local circumstances. How this is arranged has varied according to time and place.

Our initial meeting at the Veneto Club had one purpose in mind: to open up the question as to how our local Church in Melbourne might best be organised into the future, such that:

- the mission of the Gospel is at the heart of our life, worship and outreach;
- Local faith communities are arranged to allow for them to flourish, and;
- Our faith communities be effectively resourced—spiritually, ministerially and materially.

I invite you to continue to participate in this ongoing process of discernment with the parishioners of both Our Lady of the Pines, Donvale and Sts Peter and Paul's, Doncaster East.

The fruitful discussions and honest reflections evident on the day give us reason for optimism as we embark on this journey together. In fact, I cannot remember a time when the Archbishop, Vicar General and senior diocesan staff, gathered in a forum like this with both priests and lay leaders from nearly every one of our 209 parishes.

Our next step, as outlined on the day, will be to meet again, together with both our clergy and lay leaders in the regions to hear first-hand their thoughts and reflections at the local level. Again, as far as I am aware, the opportunity for open dialogue and consultation of this magnitude with the people of the Archdiocese is something that has never been embarked upon before to this extent.

At the same time, it is important to acknowledge, as you point out, that people may be feeling bruised, bewildered and uncertain and even hurt, particularly as we navigate the ups and downs of the Covid19 pandemic and other issues from our past such as the betrayal felt by many in relation to the scandal of child abuse. There is no doubt these issues have effected the confidence and faith of people in our parish communities.

Of course, it is also important for us to remember that people are also emotionally and historically connected and invested in their parish community. For many, their parish plays an important role in both their spiritual and community life – it is part of their story!

As you would appreciate, in an Archdiocese as large as ours there are a wide range of opinions when it comes to the administration of a parish community as well as each individual's personal faith experience.

As our Holy Father, Pope Francis reminds us, we are also called to be a missionary people, not inward looking and closed in on ourselves. Sometimes a different approach can throw people out of their comfort zones and sometimes it takes time to build relationships with one another based on mutual trust and respect.

All the baptised, equal in dignity, have a role in fulfilling the Church's God given mission to proclaim the good news of salvation. We are all Catholic and all belong to the one family, connected to one another in a unique way as brothers and sisters in Christ, through our common baptism.

Part of our Catholic tradition ensures that there is a wide diversity in the way the Church expresses her mission in different places throughout the ages around the world, which is one of the great riches of the universal church.

The pastoral and spiritual care carried out by both our priests and lay co-operators in bringing Christ's healing and compassionate love to His people can never be underestimated!

Once again, I thank you for your ongoing dedication to the life of your parish community and wish you the peace and joy of the Gospel!
