Take the Way of the Gospel / Mission Plan Update

A number of other parishes throughout the Archdiocese have raised similar questions and comments to our own, recorded at our Parish Community Meeting held on Sunday 22 August 2021 and sent to the Vicar General. The consultation process is working with Archbishop Peter Comensoli having acknowledging the challenges and stating - "May I add that these time frames are meant to be very flexible. First, there is the current period of some 12-18 months for prayer, discernment, and identification; and then some 3-5 years for implementation, depending on what your communities determine." These last four words are of critical importance. Please see the latest letter from the Archbishop Peter Comensoli which is attached. Also attached is the timeline/checklist that is referred to.

Another meeting of the Eastern Region was held on the 14th of September . Our Lady of the Pines was represented and our concerns, and those of other parishes, were expressed, and are helping to shape the direction going forward.

We wish to reassure you that a primary objective for Fr Jerald and the Parish Pastoral Council is to protect and preserve Our Lady of the Pines as a vibrant faith community.

GOSPEL

Some Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, 'Is it against the law for a man to divorce his wife?' They were testing him. He answered them, 'What did Moses command you?' 'Moses allowed us' they said 'to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce.' Then Jesus said to them, 'It was because you were so unteachable that he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave father and mother, and the two become one body. They are no longer two, therefore, but one body. So then, what God has united, man must not divide.' Back in the house the disciples questioned him again about this, and he said to them, 'The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another she is guilty of adultery too.' People were bringing little children to him, for him to touch them. The disciples turned them away, but when Jesus saw this he was indignant and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. I tell you solemnly, anyone who does not welcome the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.' Then he put his arms round them, laid his hands on them and gave them his blessing.

DID YOU KNOW?

Points of interest and Catholic lore

- In this text, Jesus is quoting from the Book of Genesis (Genesis 2:24), citing the second and earliest of the creation stories contained in the first two chapters of that book.
- Orthodox Jews believe that Moses was the author of the first five books of the Old Testament, known as the Pentateuch or the Torah, which means Law. Thus the designation of 'the Law of Moses'.
- In the New Testament world, both a husband and a wife could initiate divorce, but only for the gravest of reasons. This differs from the biblical Israelites, who had no law that allowed a woman to initiate divorce.
