# "LISTEN TO WHAT THE SPIRIT IS SAYING" – REFERENCE TO OVERSEAS PRIESTS (Pgs 71 & 72)

Chairman of the Parish Pastoral Council of Our Lady of the Pines Parish and on behalf our community who were disgusted in what is perceived to be offensive and racist content, I wrote to editors of the text and the Secretariat of Plenary Council to register our concern. My contact coincided with the commencement of the Plenary Council.

I explained the upset and consternation the content has caused, and the fact that appropriate editorial control and responsibility would have avoided the callus manner in which concerns were raised and the subsequent hurt to clergy and parishioners. It was requested that at some stage in the First Assembly of the Plenary Council, a public apology be made for the insensitive manner in which this topic was reported, acknowledging the hurt caused, dissociating the Plenary Council from such offensive and defamatory statements and expressing thanks to foreign-born priests for their valued contribution to our communities.

# TAKE THE WAY OF THE GOSPEL / MISSION PLAN

As advised in the last newsletter, the Eastern Region meeting on 14/09/21 highlighted that many parishes have concerns with regard the process, timing and the reasoning. This incorporates clergy and parishioners. There have been on-gong meetings of clergy with the Archbishop. The complications of COVID preventing appropriate consultation with parishioners, the speed at which the initial process was to be undertaken, the lack of clarity re the "Mission Plan", inadequate consultation across the board and the link to the Plenary Council and outcomes have all been raised. The message from the Archbishop is that this will not be rushed. Our COVID state is acknowledged as a hinderance to the required consultative processes/ requirements. It will be into 2022 before the process will gain any momentum. It was requested that each parish nominate two representatives to undertake the role of Parish Co-ordinators – conduits for information flow and facilitation. At this stage, Fr. Jerald has asked that Garry Nolan and myself be the nominal representatives, with a review of this in the New Year. The PPC commits to updating parishioners.

### Year B –30th Sunday in Ordinary Time — 24th October 2021

### GOSPEL

As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road. (Mark 10:46-52)

### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Points of interest and Catholic lore

- The title 'Son of David' was one applied to the longed-for anointed one of God. Its use here indicates that Bartimaeus has recognised Jesus as the Messiah.
- The 'blind faith' of Bartimaeus contrasts sharply with the lack of insight and understanding we have witnessed from the disciples in recent weeks. According to some traditions, John survived until the end of the first century and lived in Ephesus.
- Jericho is the main town on the west bank of the Jordan River in the south. It was the crossing point for people journeying from the north and led to the main road up to Jerusalem, 22 kilometres away. Jesus' journey to Jerusalem, and to his death, has almost ended.
- In Hebrew, Bar means 'son of ' in much the same way as Mac is used in Scotland.
   When a Jewish boy undergoes his Barmitzvah, he becomes a 'son of the law'.
- While Rabbi means 'master' or 'teacher', Rabbuni is usually employed to express familiarity with or devotion to the master or teacher
