Take the Way of the Gospel / Mission Plan Update

A number of other parishes throughout the Archdiocese have raised similar questions and comments to our own, recorded at our Parish Community Meeting held on Sunday 22 August 2021 and sent to the Vicar General. The consultation process is working with Archbishop Peter Comensoli having acknowledging the challenges and stating - "May I add that these time frames are meant to be very flexible. First, there is the current period of some 12-18 months for prayer, discernment, and identification; and then some 3-5 years for implementation, depending on what your communities determine." These last four words are of critical importance. Please see the latest letter from the Archbishop Peter Comensoli which is attached. Also attached is the timeline/checklist that is referred to.

Another meeting of the Eastern Region was held on the 14th of September. Our Lady of the Pines was represented and our concerns, and those of other parishes, were expressed, and are helping to shape the direction going forward.

We wish to reassure you that a primary objective for Fr Jerald and the Parish Pastoral Council is to protect and preserve Our Lady of the Pines as a vibrant faith community.



GOSPEL

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth. Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he said to them 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.' Peter took this up. 'What about us?' he asked him. 'We have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'I tell you solemnly, there is no one who has left house, brothers, sisters, father, children or land for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not be repaid a hundred times over, houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and land - not without persecutions – now in this present time and, in the world to come, eternal life.' (Mark 10:17-30)
