

Update to guidelines—5th of December 2021

Following our Covid incident on the 28th of November—please note the following.

- Face covering—whilst face coverings is no longer a requirement within the Church setting, we would like to encourage all parishioners to continue to wear a face covering within our Church setting. Please also continue to socially distance whilst seated. The chairs have been pushed back to the setup that we have all become accustomed to with a 1.5meter distance between the chairs. If you do move the chairs to be closer to family members, please push them back to the original position. We thank you all for your patience with this. Fr Jerald's priority is the well being and safety of all, and if we can continue to wear a face covering and socially distance, we can do our bit to help keep everyone safe.— PLEASE NOTE, THE WEARING OF FACE MASK IS NOT MANDATORY BUT A SUGGESTION ONLY. Thank you.
- Fully Vaccinated 12 years + 2 months and over: Places of worship may open for all celebrations for the fully vaccinated with no capacity or density limits.
- **Unknown Vaccination Status:** For all of our unvaccinated masses, the mass is restricted to one person per 4sqm up to a maximum of 50 parishioners.
- Community (Parish) Facilities: Is limited to the fully vaccinated only and no limits will apply.

Weekday Masses (Wed and Friday 9.00am) Up to 50 people may attend, Vaccinations is not required. Bookings are not required.

Weekend Masses (Sat 5.00pm and Sunday 9.30am) No limits apply . All attendees aged 12+ 2 months must be fully vaccinated. Bookings are not required. Please arrive early to allow time to check-in and show your Vaccination Certificate to the Covid Marshall.

5pm Sunday Mass at Ss Peter and Paul's Church for those not fully vaccinated. If you have had only one dose of the vaccine or prefer to remain unvaccinated, there will be an extra Mass each Sunday at 5.00pm at Ss Peter and Paul's Church for both SSPP and OLOP parishioners only. 50 people are permitted. Bookings are no longer required.

Check in Requirements. Please ensure you check in on arrival using the Service Victoria App. For all weekend masses except for the Sunday 5.00pm mass at SSPP, you will also need to show Proof of Vaccinate to the Covid Marshall.



Reflection on this weeks readings

Pope Francis reflects on this theme in his exhortation, The Joy of the Gospel. He warns against those Christians whose lives "seem like Lent without Easter" (EG 6), and, certainly, glum people glumly proclaiming mercy and the joy of the Good News are by no means convincing, for they appear unconvinced by their own message: "Consequently, an evangelizer must never look like someone who has just come back from a funeral!" (EG 10). Indeed, the interpretation of John the Baptist in the musical Godspell accords with this, for his singing of "Prepare ye" is anything but a dirge. While the theme of joyful anticipation continues in the first and second readings, today's gospel passage (only Luke has this episode, though elements are related to parables in Matthew) reports John teaching a message of right living that is consistent with what is to be developed in other ways by Jesus. And the effect of John's mission on the people cultivates a feeling of expectancy among them. It seems they are infected, in the best sense, by John's enthusiasm. Thus although it is not mentioned in today's gospel pericope, joy, or anticipation of it, perfuses Luke's account.

Luke's fringe dwellers are there too; they are attracted to John, firstly in the tax collectors then in the soldiers. We do not normally think of such as these as being on the fringes, since they are among those who wield considerable strength as agents of the oppressors (if we ignore for the sake of argument the Pax Romana, the widespread political stability with the benefits of trade their empire brought), but they were themselves tools of ruling powers and thus were on the fringes of the bulk of the population. For them, too, the Good News has come. And indeed the structures and agents of the empire would also provide avenues for the rapid spread of the followers of Jesus bearing the Gospel in Luke's second great journey theme: from Jerusalem to all the world.

Mary set out and went as auickly as she could to a town in the hill country of Judah. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. Now as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.' (Luke 1:39-44

DID YOU KNOW?

- In Luke's Gospel, the conception and birth of Jesus are described in parallel with the conception and birth of John the Baptist. One important difference is that the announcement of the miraculous conception of John to elderly parents comes to his father, Zechariah, while the announcement of the conception of Jesus comes to his mother, Mary.
- In Matthew's Gospel, it is Joseph who is the main protagonist, while Luke concentrates on Mary's role in cooperating in God's plan for the
- Mary undertakes a journey from Nazareth in Galilee, in the north of Israel, to the hill country of Judah in the south. This is an extraordinary journey for a young pregnant woman of her time to undertake alone!
