Update to guidelines—5th of December 2021

Following our Covid incident on the 28th of November—please note the following.

- Face covering—whilst face coverings is no longer a requirement within the Church setting, we would like to encourage all parishioners to continue to wear a face covering within our Church setting. Please also continue to socially distance whilst seated. The chairs have been pushed back to the setup that we have all become accustomed to with a 1.5meter distance between the chairs. If you do move the chairs to be closer to family members, please push them back to the original position. We thank you all for your patience with this. Fr Jerald's priority is the well being and safety of all, and if we can continue to wear a face covering and socially distance, we can do our bit to help keep everyone safe.— PLEASE NOTE, THE WEARING OF FACE MASK IS NOT MANDATORY BUT A SUGGESTION ONLY. Thank you.
- Fully Vaccinated 12 years + 2 months and over: Places of worship may open for all celebrations for the fully vaccinated with no capacity or density limits.
- **Unknown Vaccination Status:** For all of our unvaccinated masses, the mass is restricted to one person per 4sqm up to a maximum of 50 parishioners.
- Community (Parish) Facilities: Is limited to the fully vaccinated only and no limits will apply.

Weekday Masses (Wed and Friday 9.00am) Up to 50 people may attend, Vaccinations is not required. Bookings are not required.

Weekend Masses (Sat 5.00pm and Sunday 9.30am) No limits apply . All attendees aged 12+ must be fully vaccinated. Bookings are not required. Please arrive early to allow time to check-in and show your Vaccination Certificate to the Covid Marshall.

5pm Sunday Mass at Ss Peter and Paul's Church for those not fully vaccinated. If you have had only one dose of the vaccine or prefer to remain unvaccinated, there will be an extra Mass each Sunday at 5.00pm at Ss Peter and Paul's Church for both SSPP and OLOP parishioners only. 50 people are permitted. Bookings are no longer required.

Check in Requirements. Please ensure you check in on arrival using the Service Victoria App. For all weekend masses except for the Sunday 5.00pm mass at SSPP, you will also need to show Proof of Vaccinate to the Covid Marshall.

Message from Fr Jerald Welcome to the Season of Advent

After living with Covid restrictions for so long, we have now all come out of this with a huge sign of relief and gratitude that we have come this far. It is wonderful that we can now all gather once again to celebrate this very special season together as a community. Whilst we are thrilled that we can all gather in person once again for Masses and other parish activities, we understand if anyone is not comfortable joining us for the time being. Our first priority is that everyone feels safe and well.

Our Advent theme this year is "Healing and Restoration". Jeremiah 30:17 springs to mind: "But I will restore you to health and heal your wounds declares the Lord." But what does Jeremiah 30:17 mean for us today? When we search for healing Scriptures it can be tempting to forget that God's people went through many of the same difficulties that we face today. Distressing reports, a technologically-distracted society, a broken spirit and a hurting body can nag at the edges of our hearts. It is easy to be pulled away from the truth that exists in this verse. Yet even in our brokenness, God's wholeness shines through.

God uses restoration to bring healing. He is not only able to restore us, but He makes a strong affirmative statement that he is willing to do so. The Bible demonstrates that God's restorative power is different than our natural human concept of how to heal wounds or illnesses. When God restores an aspect of our lives, it is better than it was before. As believers who are cleansed by Christ's sacrifice on the cross, we can come to God with our prayers for healing and restoration knowing that God's grace will be there to meet us in our sickness.

When God restores health it is more beautiful than our human minds can comprehend. We can put our faith in the willingness of our Savior to redeem us and lead us back to him. As we keep our eyes on Christ this advent, let us lay our troubles at the foot of the cross with faith that he will restore and heal.

GOSPEL

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!' A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshingfloor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them. (Luke 3:10-18)

- Tax collectors at the time of Jesus were disliked immensely for two reasons: they collaborated with the Roman oppressors and they skimmed additional monies from the people for themselves.
- The Jewish people of this time were hopeful that a messiah would come to overthrow the tyranny of the Roman Empire and set them free
