#### SPIRITUAL NOURISHMENT NO. 1 - THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Welcome everyone to the First Sunday of Lent. As you all know, our combined Liturgy Committees have decided on a Lenten theme of "PERSEVERANCE THROUGH NOURISHMENT" which will lead you to FIVE spiritual things you can do (or perhaps maybe do better?) as we journey towards Easter Sunday.

This week we draw your attention to the first nourishment of perseverance - THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS. As we have stumbled, doubted and despaired during COVID, let's consider this week Jesus' own anguished path to Golgotha as he also stumbled, doubted and despaired. Very sadly at this time, we must also acknowledge the current tragic situation in Ukraine as its citizens also stumble and despair, and perhaps even doubt. While our own stresses that COVID dealt us should not be underestimated, they pale into insignificance with what is happening to the innocent people of Ukraine. As their cities are overrun and destroyed, citizens killed and wounded, families displaced and seeking refuge in neighbouring countries and the certain global consequences and instability, we acknowledge the CROSS of Jesus as He made his agonising way to Calvary. It is opportune and even more important this week to recognise THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS as a prayer in itself, as we ask God to bring peace to Ukraine and healing to its people.

So we invite you most earnestly to SsPP each Friday night at 7pm for The Stations of The Cross. As we journey with Jesus along the path to Calvary, let us also journey with the people of Ukraine. Let us all also reflect on our own path of difficulty and challenges over the last two years of COVID.

# Year C - 2ND SUNDAY OF LENT 13TH MARCH 2022

#### **GOSPEL**

Jesus told a parable to his disciples: 'Can one blind man guide another? Surely both will fall into a pit? The disciple is not superior to his teacher; the fully trained disciple will always be like his teacher. Why do you observe the splinter in your brother's eye and never notice the plank in your own? How can you say to your brother, "Brother, let me take out the splinter that is in your eye," when you cannot see the plank in your own? Hypocrite! Take the plank out of your own eye first, and then you will see clearly enough to take out the splinter that is in your brother's eye.

There is no sound tree that produces rotten fruit, nor again a rotten tree that produces sound fruit. For every tree can be told by its own fruit: people do not pick figs from thorns, nor gather grapes from brambles. A good man draws what is good from the store of goodness in his heart; a bad man draws what is bad from the store of badness. For a man's words flow out of what fills his heart.' (Luke 6:39–45)

## Did you know?

Points of interest and Catholic Lore: Parables are often used by Jesus as a teaching tool. They are generally brief stories with a double meaning, and we should read them for their metaphorical interpretation rather than their literal meaning.
