If you need to dispose of a vehicle either from a deceased estate or which is no longer required, please consider gifting it to the "Lifeboat Geelong Foundation", a registered charity with tax deductible status which for nine years has been providing pastoral and practical support to nearly 150 victims / survivors of church-related sexual abuse. Many of these suffer post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and have limited or no employment. A donated vehicle could vastly improve their quality of life.



Gospel

Luke 14:25-33

Great crowds accompanied Jesus on his way and he turned and spoke to them. "If any man comes to me without hating his father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes and his own life too, he cannot be my disciple. Anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. And indeed, which of you here, intending to build a tower, would not first sit down and work out the cost to see if he had enough to complete it? Otherwise, if he laid the foundation and then found himself unable to finish the work, the onlookers would all start making fun of him and saying, _Here is a man who started to build and was unable to finish," Or again, what king marching

to war against another king would not first sit down and consider whether with ten thousand men he could stand up to the other who advanced against him with twenty thousand? If not, then while the other king was still a long way o he would send envoys to sue for peace. So in the same way, none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions."

- What has your decision to follow Jesus cost you?
- Are there times when you feel that you may be unable to
 'finish the work'? What is hindering your progress on your journey?
 -How well do you plan ahead for your life in eternity?

DID YOU KNOW?

- -The use of the term 'hate' in this text should not be taken to mean hatred as such but rather should be understood as pointing to things that may hinder the single-mindedness needed to take up the call to discipleship.
- -The Greek word ekklesia, used for the Church, means being called out from or apart from others. This understanding is suggested by Jesus' words in this text.
- -A recurrent theme in Luke's Gospel is that obsessive attachment to money or material wealth is a hindrance to a full and complete relationship with God. It distracts people from what is really important in life.
