RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

- Baptised Christians seeking to become full sacramental members of the Catholic Church
- Catholics who were baptised but did not receive catechetical formation or instruction, and who typically did not celebrate the sacraments of Confirmation or Holy Eucharist.

Reaching Out to Our Beloved Parishioners in Nursing Homes


As a caring and tight-knit community, we always strive to ensure that all members of our parish feel connected and included, regardless of their circumstances.

For those in nursing homes located within a feasible distance, we are eager to arrange visits and offer the opportunity to receive communion if desired. It's a meaningful way to remind our fellow parishioners that they remain an integral part of our church family.

PPC & Finance Committee – Updates

- The PPC & Finance Committee are preparing to brief Fr. Toan on his arrival. Matters on which we will be briefing include; PPC/Finance functionality, Child Safety policy, the Archdiocese Mission plan and the OLOP financial situation.
- Work is being undertaken to audit the Thanksgiving/Sacrificial Offering/Stewardship program to ensure all who wish to contribute via direct debit (credit card etc.) or pledging via the parish website, are accounted for. We are aware that there have been some issues during and post COVID where requests to set up a donation process did not progress and some who have changed banking particulars also dropped off. The Finance Committee would ask you to check your statements to see that your financial support is being received and if you need to re-set or set up a process, to please contact the parish office. The Thanksgiving/Sacrificial Offering/ Stewardship program is the mechanism by which OLOP can remain financial and service our community.
- There have been cases recently where spam e-mails have been distributed under the names of members of our parish – highjacked e-mail addresses. Please be careful when checking e-mails, particularly those with attachments or links. If not sure, don't open.
- VINNIES The OLOP community donated \$8337.15 to the Vinnies' Winter Appeal. A tremendous effort in supporting not only the work of Vinnies, but also supporting those in OLOP who work in this ministry. In the 2022/2023 financial year, the OLOP Conference distributed \$96,897 in support across their areas of responsibility.



Readings

Matthew 15:21-28

Jesus left Gennesaret and withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. Then out came a Canaanite woman from that district and started shouting, 'Sir, Son of David, take pity on me. My daughter is tormented by a devil.' But he answered her not a word. And his disciples went and pleaded with him. 'Give her what she wants,' they said, 'because she is shouting after us.' He said in reply, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel.' But the woman had come up and was kneeling at his feet. 'Lord', she said, 'help me.' He replied, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the house-dogs.' She retorted, Ah, yes, Sir; but even house dogs can eat up the scraps that fall from their master's table. 'Then Jesus answered her, 'Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be aranted.'

DID YOU KNOW?

- The cities of Tyre and Sidon were the leading towns of ancient Phoenicia. Both cities were on the Mediterranean coast of what is now modern Lebanon. The Phoenicians were descendants of the even more ancient Canaanites who populated the area earlier.
- Israel despised the Canaanites. It loathed the Canaanite religion with its pagan gods and fertility cults and found many of their practices abominable.
